


Rocky Mountain Farmers Union Cooperative Leadership Camp

- We are a small camp in terms of campers, but we have at least 15 staff members on site. This allows us to get to know each other quite well and to build our camp community,
- We are committed to the physical, emotional and mental development of all campers,
- All staff go through an extensive application process which includes written and verbal interviews, background checks and reference checks. They receive extensive hands-on training in first aid/CPR, child development, behavioral guidance and emergency procedures,

CAMPERS NOT RIDING THE BUS: Check-in at the Education Center in Bailey is scheduled from 1:00—2:00 p.m. on your arrival date. Please do not arrive any earlier than 1:00 p.m. Parents should pick up campers between 1:00—2:00 p.m. on the departure date.

DIRECTIONS To CAMP: Bailey is approximately 40 miles west of Denver on Highway 285 (Hampden Avenue in metro Denver). It is the town after Pine Junction and at the bottom of Crow Hill. Once you travel down Crow Hill into Bailey, take the first left between the restaurant and propane dealer. Follow the road ½ mile to the entrance of the NFU Education Center. Drive through the large wooden entrance and proceed to the A-frame building.

A camper incentive? First time campers who register by April 30, will save \$10 on their registration fee.

Returning campers can receive \$5 off registration for each new camper they recruit. To receive the discount the returning camper and the new camper must submit their completed registration and medical form by the May 28 deadline.

A returning camper will receive one KP-Free pass for each recruitment. The pass can be used during camp to skip one KP duty such as serving meals, washing dishes, hall clean-up, etc.

We have the best staff!

Experienced staff lead our campers in exciting and new challenges. A full-time nurse is located on the premises and accompanies campers on all hikes and outings. A full-staffed kitchen prepares scrumptious meals, that even the pickiest eaters will enjoy. All staff have undergone extensive reference and background checks.

You need your rest to be at your best! Sleeping accommodations are in staff-supervised dormitorystyle bunkhouses. Bunkhouses are separated between female and male. Bring a sleeping bag and pillow.

- ◆ Campers are allowed to bring personal cell phones, but may only be used during free time. Cell phones are to remain in the bunk area during sessions and organized activities.

- ◆ Under Colorado law, each child attending camp must have a completed registration and a medical form. The health history form and immunization record must be signed by a doctor. Forms that are not completed in their entirety will be returned for completion. ENROLLMENT IS NOT COMPLETE UNTIL ALL FORMS ARE SUBMITTED AND REVIEWED BY THE EDUCATION DIRECTOR.
